

Welcome to the first edition of the Mornington Shire Council Community Newsletter.

Excited to bring you a brand new Council newsletter.

Everyone should be proud of the great things happening in our community and this newsletter will share some highlights.

Council has had big financial and operational challenges for many years. We have been focussed on fixing them. Recently we recruited our new, highly experienced CEO and Executive Team to turn Council operations around; and we are on target to make the first budget surplus in a long time

We're focussed on improving operations and services, hiring locals and growing our workforce. Trainees, trades assistants and apprentices recruitment is happening. We are working with the school to include training opportunities for students as well.

There are lots of building activities going on; two 5 bedroom community houses; single men's accommodation; and a subdivision for future housing.

We'll soon have a new youth drop-in centre for kids to call their own; a million-dollar painting program; and a \$4 million upgrade program for community houses. We are working on upgrading our water, sewerage and

waste systems, as well as renewing our fleet, plant and equipment too.

A big thank you for the deadly work being done by our local roads team. Thanks too to everyone involved with the recent cruise ship visit including our Elders, dancers, Arts Centre team and guides. The Silver Explorer cruise ship passengers loved their day on Mornington Island. Council is keen to develop cultural and eco-tourism activities and there will be lots of work, as well as economic development opportunities for local community members.

I am very proud to be Mayor of our community and of the direction that we are now taking.

With little lead time, on Thursday 18 May 2023, approximately 120 passengers arrived on zodiac boats at Mornington Island.

They enjoyed a Welcome to Country and dance performances. Passengers also visited the Arts Centre (Mirndiyan Gununa Art and Cultural Centre), took guided walks with Traditional Owners to learn about local flora, fauna, and customs, and explored the

surrounding landscapes on a four-wheel-drive adventure. Council thanks everyone involved who worked hard to ensure that the passengers had a great time. The passengers were really thankful for their experiences and passed on their congratulations related to the dancing, quality of the artwork and the beautiful Mornington Island scenery.

There is massive potential for tourism on the island, creating employment, engaging local young people; and showcasing what the island has to offer. Council is now exploring ways to schedule more cruise ship visits and other eco-tourism options.

WASTE MANAGEMENT NEWS

RUBBISH BIN WASTE AUDIT

Council has engaged an organisation called EC Sustainable to conduct a full waste audit across the Island.

The team will be looking at different types of waste streams and the information will be used to determine the best solutions to minimise the volume of waste that goes into landfill.

A waste audit involves selecting bins at random and categorising all the different types of rubbish that is found in there.

The information will also provide information related to potential recycling options like processing plastic to become garden pavers. Information from the audit will also help with the planning and design of a waste transfer station, ensuring that it suits the community's needs. *The audit will begin during July.*

WAREHOUSE ACTIVITIES

The warehouse team work to ensure that weekly barge deliveries are unloaded each Wednesday morning, quickly and safely.

There are a range of items including vehicles, demountable buildings, hardware, tools, shop food and variety items that are distributed throughout the community.

A stocktake of all warehouse items was recently undertaken, for End of Financial Year requirements. Council will be progressively reviewing the items that are available for purchase in the warehouse and improving our procurement processes, to ensure value for money, as well as formal Local Buy approaches.

MORNINGTON ISLAND AIRPORT RUNWAY LINEMARKING & CIVIL WORKS

Council completed upgrade works at the airport during May 2023. New line marking occurred on the runway to ensure that it is compliant with mandatory aviation standards.

An important electrical and lighting inspection also occurred and aircraft passengers might also notice new drainage works at the passenger walkway, designed to reduce localised flooding.

There has also been significant upgraded drainage works around the runway strip, to prevent any water from pooling and flooding on the runway apron.

Council now looks forward to other airport improvements and projects.
