Mayor's Message

As we approach another Christmas and wet season,
I would like to reflect on what has been a difficult year with the passing of
some of our loved ones. The year has also included achievements for
Council and community. As time passes, we lose more of our deeply respected
elders and the traditional knowledge which binds us to our history and culture.
I know we all feel this deeply. Council has been working hard to create a platform
for future resilience and prosperity for the whole community. We have supported and
invested in helping to reestablish our cultural festivals through Mirndiyan Gununa
Arts and Cultural Centre, which was a truly great success and will be even greater next year.

We have initially focussed on **fixing Council's financial problems**; and we now have a profitable council operation. I have been outspoken on the lack of value we receive for the money that comes to community. We are now taking more control of these investments and are establishing a **community decision making group** representing all families in the community. The community decision making group will decide on future community priorities.

I have also been able to get **net fishing banned** from our traditional waters which will safeguard the fishing resources for all our families into the future. You will have seen the significant increase in **building activity** throughout the town which includes a facility to bring in tradesmen to fix our homes – a major priority for next year. We are also building homes and plug-ins (like granny flats) for locals. Single men's accommodation should start being built early in the new year and tavern building works are happening, too. We are in the process of final planning related to a **thirteen-block land development and subdivision**, for local housing.

The **Youth Hub** building has been completed and is being used over Christmas for various youth activities. You will see this thrive and grow next year as we look to support our youth; and address problems they are currently facing

We have also commenced our **tourism activities** with the first cruise ship visit this year. In addition, we have invested significant time, energy and money into our **local employment**, **apprenticeships and traineeships**. This will expand significantly next year and **student work experience** will be introduced, too.

Finally, you will have seen the massive investment into our road works to ensure that **roads are drivable all year round**, as well as important **water and sewerage upgrades**. This will continue next year, too. Council is pleased that the Queensland Government have listened. Much needed **renal chairs for dialysis treatment** at the local hospital should be up and running in 2024. That will then ensure that our mob can move back home.

The **Salvation Army shop** located in Lardil Street has been a terrific win for the community. It needs staff, so if anyone wants to put their hand up, please see Council.

Council has worked hard to deliver everything that mainstream councils do. Our remoteness and uniqueness have contributed to a challenging year, but it has also been a pleasure serving my people and addressing critical needs, for us to be successful.

I wish everyone a very merry Christmas and a happy new year.









I arrived on beautiful Mornington Island in February this year and I am grateful to have been welcomed by so many good people in the community.

I have a simple belief that the only reason the Council exists is for the benefit of the community, and that employment with Council provides the opportunity for people to help their community.

#### **ANIMAL MANAGEMENT**

It is important that all pet dogs are always suitably restrained.

Dogs should be kept in yards. They should not be roaming the streets.

**WATER WATER.** We know it gets hot in the wet season, so it's important to ensure that all pets have plenty of fresh drinking water.

If you see any wandering horses, please do not approach them. Horses are supposed to be kept in the paddocks at the rodeo grounds at all times.

Council's Environmental Health team has been out and about conducting a domestic animal survey. This helps Council understand the number of pets on the island, as well as community opinion related to de-sexing and microchipping.

Council will consider the prospect of registrations for animals in 2024. Parasite reduction programs will continue, too.

#### **BUILDING WORKS AROUND TOWN**

#### **Council Administration Building**

Council's administration building in Lardil Street is almost complete. During early 2024 staff will relocate from the Mission Road offices near the tavern, to the new facility. This will ensure that Council's customer service point is more conveniently located for the community.

#### **VAC Development**

Council is particularly excited about ensuring that additional accommodation will soon be available for contractors and support staff at the Visitor Accommodation Centre (VAC) Complex. Additions to the facility will include a dining room, fully equipped kitchen, as well as bathroom and laundry facilities. There will also be an additional, thirty-two rooms, most of which have ensuites!

#### **Duplex Homes**

Contractors have been working on two five bedroom duplex homes in Lardil Street. The additional community housing should be completed in early 2024.

#### Library

Early in the new year, works will also commence on a new community library. The library will be located on the same site as Council's new administration building and will be a place for recreational reading, activities, as well as education and learning. Footings should be in the ground by February 2024.

#### **Subdivision Approval**

During December Council received funding approval for a thirteen-lot subdivision opposite the Arts Centre. This subdivision will enable more community housing to be built.

Much more building activity is planned in the new year.




